Sight and Sound takes all reasonable steps to verify the stories it publishes.

In 2021 Sight and Sound editorial staff did not undertake any training with specific regards to editorial standards.

In 2021 the magazine received no substantive complaints.

In 2021 no Standards Investigations were required to be carried out.

In 2021 there was no requirement for any arbitration processes.
